



# How we are doing in 2023

- In the 36 weeks to 11th August, we have supplied over 1500 parcels, averaging 42 a week, helping over 100 adults and children every week.
- Each of them now receives bread, fruit, vegetables and milk as well as significant amounts of other food including pasta, beans and tinned meat in the case of a family worth well over £65.
- We deliver to our clients' doors. We also help with basics including toiletries, nappies and even pet food. Dietary needs are cared for.
- Our combined food poverty outreach projects now help approximately 200 adults and children every single week.



## A FOOD BANK AND MORE...

# £35,000 in local outreach this year

- Helping up to 40 people a week through our support for Milborne Port Food Share.
- Supplying hot meals via Sherborne Community Kitchen (now The Lunch Club) to 10 housebound people every week.
- Supporting 10 people from our area every week to attend Sturminster Newton Vale Pantry

   a social supermarket.
- Paying for 20 pupils a day every day to have a free school meal if they are just above the threshold for entitlement.
- Providing free snacks, milk and breakfast to young people in need at youth centres and schools.
